### **32 Hour - Industrial Refrigeration Operator and Ammonia Safety Training**

The class begins with ammonia safety demonstrations and discussions. It continues with fundamentals of refrigeration, refrigeration terminology, refrigeration system components (evaporators, condensers, compressors, valves, vessels, etc.) while using RETA's Industrial Refrigeration Study Course books. Additional demonstrations and discussions are scheduled on such topics as: oil draining, stop valve safety and proper operation, back pressure regulator valve operation and troubleshooting, checking compressor safeties and more. The practical goals of this section of the course are to have each attendee leave with a very sound understanding of their own plant's system, reduce maintenance hours, extend component life cycle and operate efficiently, be able to draw their system, and discuss said system in proper refrigeration terms.
